

THE APRIL TERM HELD ON THE 26th DAY OF JUNE 2023

The County Commission convened at 9:00 a.m., pursuant to adjournment on June 26, 2023.

Present: Joseph Kaimann, Presiding Commissioner; Mike Mueller, Associate Commissioner District 1; Matt Bass, Associate Commissioner District 2; Kenneth Schulte, County Clerk; and Aimee Vann, Deputy Clerk.

The following proceedings were held:

Invocation given by Commissioner Bass.

Eric Tapley, Highway Department

- Discussed road construction projects: Low water crossing repair work is scheduled to be completed this week; Hammett Rd repair and detour should begin week of July 10th; Crews are finishing up work on David Rd in preparation of upcoming asphalt work; Culvert replacements are planned for Kinker Dr at John Creech Rd this week; Mowers have been operating daily.
- Asphalt on Jordan and S. Jordan Rds. are complete; Overlay on Harmony Grove Rd will occur this week.
- Discussed updates with appraisals and meetings pertaining to the Outer Rd project.
- Resident, Tina Day of the Public Water Supply District #1, requested that the County take over maintenance Firehouse Lane. Request denied.
- Residents, Margie and Larry Galkowski of Stoneridge Villas (located off of S. Ethlyn) requested that the County to consider taking over maintenance of Canyon Creek Circle and Canyon Creek Court. The asphalt is in bad repair and deteriorating which causes potential hazards for any emergency response personnel. Residents were advised that it is not something that the County can do at this time.

Robert Henebry, Project Coordinator

- Henebry presented his report on current projects: Discussed current bid reviews and upcoming bid lettings; Discussed Sheriff's Department lot containers and future use, Asphaltting CID to occur this week; Highway Department construction to begin soon, met Gateway Fiber to move fiber line out of construction area; Bridges of Hope permits have been approved, Corrected HVAC design still in process.
- Report on the status of the Courthouse remodel: Window tinting in Collectors office to occur this week, July 5th will consist of moving Collectors Office staff into the completed office; Assessors Office to have painting and some flooring completed next, Also included is the doorway modification between offices to add additional space.
- Complex 1 Building in need of new HVAC before winter. Jarrell Mechanical Contractors provided quotes for a Trane system (\$13,975) and a Carrier system (\$15,006). It was decided to go with the Trane system.

Brenda O'Brien, Treasurer

- O'Brien presented the Sales and Gas Tax Reports for the month of June. O'Brien reports that sales tax was up 0.6% for the month and remains up 0.3% for the year compared to the same period during 2022. Gas tax was up 18.2% for the month and remains up 21.9% for the year compared to the same period during 2022.


New/Unfinished Business


- Rhonda Shafer, MU Extension, presented updates on 4-H activities kicking off for the summer; update on fair livestock exhibits for the 2023 Lincoln County Fair; and updates on general extension activities; Overnight camp occurred this year for the 1st time since 2019 with 75 children in attendance; 4-H day with the Cardinals occurred in May with 2,761 4-H members in attendance (Cardinals won); Youth informational workshops pertaining to financial management, mental health, and driving preparedness planned; Current financials are steady for the year.
- Group of Lincoln County residents met to have a dialectical discussion on the creation of planning and zoning within Lincoln County. Discussion of when and how to place the request on the general ballot occurred. Information pertaining to Planning and Zoning may be found in the Revised Statutes of Missouri, Chapter 64 (pertaining to second-class

counties).
