The County Commission convened at 9:00 a.m., pursuant to adjournment on May 1, 2023.

Present: Joseph Kaimann, Presiding Commissioner; Matt Bass, Associate Commissioner District 2; and Aimee Vann, Deputy Clerk. Absent: Mike Mueller, Associate Commissioner District 1

The following proceedings were held:

Invocation given by Commissioner Bass.

New Business

- Commissioner Bass made a motion to approve the open session minutes from April 24, and 25, 2023. Commissioner Kaimann second. All ayes to carry the motion.

Julie Rodgers, Economic Development

- Discussed upcoming businesses that are interested in moving into Lincoln County; Discussed the status of ongoing projects and expansion; Discussed various infrastructure activities and the county implications; Discussed workforce development propositions; and discussed upcoming community events.

Adam Stanek, Emergency Management Director

- Reported on CPR/AED training that took place on 4/18 and the mock car crash at Winfield High School on 4/19; Discussed the upcoming inspections for the AEDs.
- Reported that the EMPG grant was approved for the 2nd Quarter of 2023; Reported that the RHSOC grant was received for new radios in the amount of \$29,000 and they are pending delivery.
- Discussed a possible revision in the Emergency Operating Procedures regarding the dust storm incident that took place in Illinois.
- Reported that Lincoln County was recertified as a National Storm Ready County.

Quentin Laws, Floodplain Administrator

- Reported that the Mississippi River is expected to crest at 30ft near the Winfield Lock and Dam 25; Discussed possibility of further flooding possibilities due to expected snow up North
- Reported that the CRS (Community Rating System) has been approved until 2024
- Reported that the supplemental pay grant for the Sheriff's Department was approved; Assisted the Sheriff with a Child Sex Crimes grant application

Sheriff Rick Harrell**Randy Lambert, Undersheriff**

- Reported there are currently 93 federal inmates housed in the jail; 144 total inmates.
- Discussed status of the department; Discussed further support in identifying all concerns and issues when determining if an inmate is 'fit for confinement'.
- Discussed possibility of enacting a countywide curfew for minors as well as further public education pertaining to the Missouri graduated drivers' license

Dan Heavin, Coroner

- Discussed the accident at MO 79 and Highway C; Discussed the use of a Forensic Odontologist and a Forensic Anthropologist to assist with the recent accident investigation
- Dan Heavin, Coroner was Elected President and Stephanie Wahoski, Chief Deputy Coroner, was Elected Director of Troop C, of the Missouri Coroners' and Medical Examiners Association on 4/24

New Business


- The Commission read aloud and signed a proclamation declaring the first week of May as Elk's Youth Week to recognize young people for their involvement with and achievements in the community.
